Small Group Questions

1. Reread John Luke 7:35-50. What stands out to you? What is challenging to you?



2. In our world today, who are deemed the “untouchable”. What group or people are harder for us to connect with and love?

***“In this story there are two characters (sinful woman; Pharisee) who suffer from the same disease (being untouchable: one is in the church, other hasn't been to church). She's untouchable by holy people, because of the nature and scope of her sinfulness. The Pharisee is also untouchable because he made himself untouchable because he won't allow himself to be touched by the brokenness and sadness of other people She's untouchable because of her action, he is because of his inaction.*”**



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3. In the New Testament, Jesus often ministers to the “untouchable”. Why is that so difficult for us to do?

Lessons learned from the woman:

1. She worshipped boldly!
2. She worshipped humbly!
3. She worships honestly.
4. She worships extravagantly.

4. How can we actively refrain from bringing up past sins of others? Is this difficult? What makes its hard?



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5. What does it mean to worship boldly? How is this seen in your life? How is this seen at New Salem?

6. How do we worship humbly? What things can hinder us from worshipping humbly? How do we remove those?

7. How do we worship honestly and extravagantly? How can we encourage others to do the same?
