1. Reread Haggai chapter 1. What stands out to you? What is challenging to you?



2. What are your stated priorities? When surveying your life, what are your actual priorities? Do they line up?

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3. If you make time for what's important to you, why do important things (or people) often get neglected?

7. In order for us to aligned our priorities, we must confess and commit to do what we have been called to do. What do you need to confess and what will you commit to?
