3. What does it mean to be "God's workmanship"? What are the implications and requirements?

5. Read Ephesians 4:1-16. Paul gives a description of what it looks like to have a unified body. Reflect on some of the characteristics Paul challenges each member to possess. Are you doing your part? In what specific areas do you have room for improvement?
